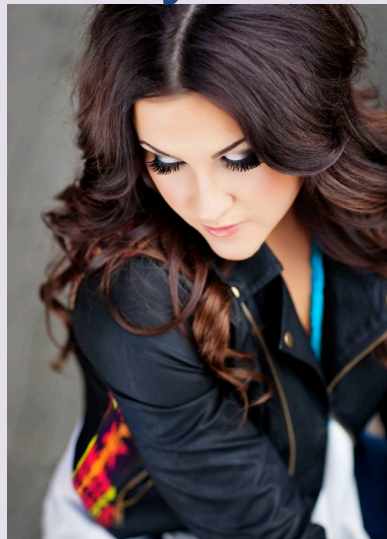


Ashley Barron
